Talbot County Community Center Exhibits

There are 3 separate exhibit venues in the Talbot County Community Center. The South Lobby hosts a rotating exhibit of selected artists, the Wye Oak Room (where we meet) hosts a rotating exhibit of prints for all club members and the Chesapeake and Skipjack Rooms are transitioning to a permanent exhibit of photographs donated by members of the Club to the Talbot County Parks and Recreation Department.

South Lobby

Currently Joe Soares, Janet Kerr, Cal Jackson and Steve Aprile are exhibiting in this venue. It's time for Joe Soares and Janet Kerr's prints to rotate out, so there is room for 8 to 10 prints for one or two interested artists. These prints can include broader subject matter than Talbot County specific scenes and must be framed with plexiglass. Prints are usually on display for up to six months.

Chesapeake and Skipjack Rooms

These permanent exhibits are almost full, but there is still room for 4 to 6 prints. These prints should be limited to Talbot County scenes (Scenes related to the Parks and Recreation Department mission or facilities are appreciated) and must be framed in plexiglass.

Wye Oak Room

This room can hold 12 to 16 prints, depending on size. Currently the candidates for last years Print of the Year competition are on display, but it is time to rotate new photographs into the Wye Oak Room. These pictures should be limited to Talbot County scenes, but may be framed in glass, although plexiglass is still preferred. This room is used for many outside meetings, so the photographs receive some nice exposure.
